

Community Advisory Group Work Plan

Purpose

The main purposes of the Community Advisory Group are to:

- Learn about Puget Sound Energy’s (PSE) proposed route segments, PSE’s route analysis work to date, and the complexity of identifying the route segments
- Collaborate with PSE on a community values-based evaluation process that will be used by the advisory group to consider PSE’s proposed route segments, combine segments into possible route options, and narrow route options down to recommended route(s)
- Provide a forum for the community to give meaningful input on route segments and route options
- Help PSE better understand community values as it selects the preferred route that balances the needs of their customers, the local community and PSE

Meeting #4b <i>July 9, 2014</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue conversation from Meeting #4a • Narrow all route options to a smaller set to share with the community for feedback • Determine and weight evaluation factors to use in Multi-Objective Decision Analysis (MODA) of route options <p><i>Outcome: Develop narrowed set of route options to share with the community for review and feedback, and determine weighted evaluation factors to use in selection of recommended route option(s)</i></p>
Meeting #5 <i>October 1, 2014*</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consider feedback from Community Meetings in September • Conduct MODA process using weighted evaluation factors to identify recommended route(s) • Compare weighted scores to identify recommended route(s) <p><i>Outcome: Develop recommended route(s) to share with the community for review and feedback</i></p>
Meeting #6 <i>December 10, 2014*</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consider feedback from Community Meetings in November • Make recommendation to PSE on route(s) to consider <p><i>Outcome: Develop final route(s) recommendation for submittal to PSE</i></p>
