Puget Sound Energy's contractor Historical Research Associates (HRA) is conducting an architectural survey to inform the permitting process for the Energize Eastside project.

The architectural survey will help PSE and government agencies, including the Washington State Department of Archaeological and Historic Preservation (DAHP), understand the historic character and significance of buildings and structures along the Energize Eastside route options. We will use data from the survey to meet planning and review responsibilities under existing local, state and federal regulations and procedures.

What to expect

- HRA is collecting data on buildings and structures nearing 40 years of age or older, taking photographs, and documenting architectural details related to style, design, materials and workmanship.
- This is an observational survey, so HRA's twoperson team is conducting this work from sidewalks and other public rights of ways.
- HRA's staff will not enter private properties.
- We expect this survey will be completed by the end of February 2017.

Frequently Asked Questions

What happens with the data?

The survey data will be added to Washington State's database of historic resources and used by HRA and DAHP to determine whether buildings within one parcel of the transmission line may be eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places and/or Washington Heritage Register for their architectural character.

What happens if my property is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places or the Washington Heritage Register?

While a building or structure may be considered eligible for listing on national, state, city or county registers, the decision to do so remains with the property owner.
