

Briefing Notes: Horizon View

Purpose and overview: The Horizon View Neighborhood Homeowners Association invited Puget Sound Energy (PSE) to provide a presentation on the Energize Eastside project and answer community questions at their Oct. 24 meeting. The Horizon View neighborhood is not directly affected by the Energize Eastside project. The neighborhood is located approximately 0.75 miles east of the existing transmission line corridor that runs through the Somerset neighborhood.

At the briefing, the project team:

- Updated residents about the project
- Informed the neighborhood about how they can get involved
- Answered questions and learned about community concerns

Format: Kelsey Knowles, Senior Local Government Affairs Representative, and Keri Pravitz, Community Projects Manager, attended the meeting. Keri gave a presentation on Energize Eastside. Topics included an overview of the project, why the project is needed and how the need has been verified, public outreach since the launch of the project, route options, photo simulations and next steps for the project. Following the presentation Keri answered questions from community members.
